BEFORE YOU START

- **Understand the Criteria:** Carefully review the award criteria to ensure you address all the key areas they are looking for, such as innovation, impact, dedication, etc.
- Gather Evidence: Collect specific examples, data and anecdotes that demonstrate the nominee's excellence in early childhood education and care.
- Use Clear Language: Write clearly and concisely, avoiding jargon or overly technical language that may obscure the nominee's achievements.
- Focus on Quality, Not Quantity: It's better to provide a few strong, well-supported points rather than overwhelming the judges with too much information.
- **Be Authentic:** Ensure that your nomination reflects the genuine qualities and contributions of the nominee. Avoid exaggeration or embellishment.
- **Personalise the Nomination:** Share personal stories or testimonials that showcase the nominee's passion, dedication, and positive impact on children and families.
- Include Supporting Materials: If allowed, attach supplementary materials such as letters of support, videos or photographs that further illustrate the nominee's impact.
- **Proof-read and Edit:** Before submitting, carefully proof-read your nomination for clarity, coherence, and correctness. A well-presented nomination shows respect for the award and the judging process.

SPOTLIGHT YOUR IMPACT

- **Highlight Achievements:** Focus on the nominee's accomplishments and contributions to the field. Include measurable outcomes wherever possible.
- **Describe Unique Approaches:** Detail any innovative methods, programs, or initiatives the nominee has implemented to enhance early childhood education.
- **Emphasise Leadership:** If applicable, highlight the nominee's leadership qualities, such as mentoring others, leading projects, or advocating for the profession.
